Sponsored by USU's Center for Integrated BioSystems, posters will be presented Friday, December 5, 2008 in the Eccles Conference Center, Room 205/207. Undergraduate student researchers in the areas of Animal, Dairy and Veterinary Sciences, Biology, Biological and Irrigation Engineering, Chemistry, Nutrition and Food Sciences, Plants, Soils and Bioremediation, and Wildland Resources will present the results of their research from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. The event will be an impressive showcase of undergraduate student research.

The Center for Integrated BioSystems was established in over five years ago to enhance the study of agriculture and life sciences through an integrated and collaborative approach. Collaboration starts at the student level. Undergraduate presenters were selected from a very competitive field and join with graduate students who also receive support for their research to network and establish cross-disciplinary collaborations.
